"I BELIEVE IN LIFE EVERLASTING"

1020 The Christian who unites his own death to that of
Jesus views it as a step towards him and an entrance
into everlasting life. When the Church for the last
time speaks Christ's words of pardon and absolution
over the dying Christian, seals him for the last time
with a strengthening anointing, and gives him Christ
in viaticum as nourishment for the journey, she
speaks with gentle assurance.

THE PARTICULAR JUDGMENT

1021 Death puts an end to human life as the time open
to either accepting or rejecting the divine grace mani-
fested in Christ. The New Testament speaks of judg-
ment primarily in its aspect of the final encounter
with Christ in his second coming, but also repeatedly
affirms that each will be rewarded immediately after
death in accordance with his works and faith. The
parable of the poor man Lazarus and the words of
Christ on the cross to the good thief, as well as other
New Testament texts speak of a final destiny of the
soul—a destiny which can be different for some and
for others.

1022 Each man receives his eternal retribution in his
immortal soul at the very moment of his death, in a
particular judgment that refers his life to Christ: ei-
ther entrance into the blessedness of heaven—
through a purification or immediately—or immediate
and everlasting damnation.

HEAVEN

1023 Those who die in God's grace and friendship and
are perfectly purified live for ever with Christ. They
are like God for ever, for they "see him as he is," face
to face.
